Clause 43 Rejection of foodstuffs and import prohibition

Without any further alteration of the General Conditions for Insurance of Goods the insurance is extended also to cover depreciation of the goods caused by rejection by a checking authority such as the National Food Administration or the National Institute for Plant Protection or similar authorities.

Apprehended or established depreciation shall be reported to the carrier and the Insurer immediately.

A prerequisite for indemnity is that the goods have been exported in accordance with the import regulations issued by the country of import.

This insurance does not cover indemnity for claims arising from

- loss of market.
- incorrect description of rejected goods,
- documentation error, or
- depreciation of goods shipped from the country of export after an import prohibition has been introduced for such goods in the country of import.

As to goods shipped prior to that import prohibition has been introduced, indemnity is paid

- only for costs in connection with reshipment to the country of export,
 or
- for transport costs to another country, provided such costs do not exceed the transport costs as above.

Indemnity as above is paid only when the import prohibition has entered into force.
